Course Description and Purpose

Managerial economics is the study of applying economic analysis to managerial decision making. The primary focus of managerial economics is to understand how managers make economic decisions by allocating the scarce resources at their disposal. A manager must understand the behavior of other decision makers, such as consumers, workers, other managers, and governments to make an accurate decision. In this class, we study decision making by such participants in the economy, and we show how managers can use this understanding to be successful.

Course Objectives

Upon completing this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Apply economic reasoning to business decisions.
- 2. Understand the fundamentals of individual and firm behavior.
- 3. Estimate simple equations using regression and apply them in an economic context.
- 4. Use optimization to determine equilibria under a variety of market structures.
- 5. Apply game theory to economic decision making.
- 6. Analyze advanced pricing strategies under market power.
- 7. Explain the role of uncertainty on business decision making.
- 8. Explain the role of asymmetric information on business decision making.
- 9. Explain the role of government policies on business decision making.



Essay Expectations:

- · All essays are graded and mandatory.
- Each posting should be a minimum of three paragraphs: The introduction, the body, and the conclusion.
- Word totals for each post should be in the 400-500 words range.
- Please pay extreme attention to proper citation and to avioid Plagiarism.
- You are discouraged from using any Al tools and any text- generating software (such as ChatGPT, iA Writer, Marmot or Botowski). Remember
 that the material generated by these programs may be inaccurate, incomplete, or otherwise problematic. Beware that use may also stifle your own
 independent thinking and creativity. Also remember that the purpose of this assignment is to improve your economic way of thinking. Hence, any use
 of Al tools will be treated as plagiarism. Please contact your instructor if you are unsure or have questions BEFORE using Al for any assignment.
- We will use Turnitin to detect plagiarism and Al usage. Please check for your Turnitin score after submission and change your writing if necessary before the due date.
- · Provide supporting evidence and concepts from the readings or a related experience. Include (in-text) citation whenever it is needed.

Essay Suggestions and the Grading Rubric

Please take the following suggestions into account when writing your essay:

- 1. Include a reference, link, or citation when appropriate. It is plagiarism to use other writers' words and IDEAS.
- 2. Quotations should not be used.
- 3. Avoid informal language, jargon, and slang. Example: Prefer "It is likely that ..." "It may be the case ..." etc. rather than "I believe" or "I think". Prefer "conducted a study" instead of "did a study" "examined" instead of "looked at" "utilize" instead of "use" (where appropriate) "great deal" instead of "a lot" "furthermore" instead of run-on sentences.

- 4. Reserve the use of scientific and professional words to the key concepts of your manuscript.
- 5. Please use scientific results and date with your interpretation using words rather than assuming that the facts speak for themselves.
- 6. Be organized in your thoughts and ideas.
- 7. Stay on topic.
- 8. Provide evidence of critical, college-level thinking and thoughtfulness in your responses or interactions.
- 9. Avoid summarizing.
- 10. Be aware of grammar and sentence mechanics.
